





 The Center for International Mobility, an important and centralized international welcome service

In Rennes, 12 higher-learning institutions and Rennes Métropole joined together to create the Center for Internationality Mobility (Rennes CMI) which offers services to international students, doctoral students, and researchers. You can take advantage of its services if you are enrolled in an institution which is a member of the International Mobility Center: Université Rennes 1, Université Rennes 2, AgroCampus, Centrale Supélec, ENSAI, Ecole nationale supérieure de Chimie, ENS Rennes, IMT Atlantique, INSA, Sciences Po Rennes and Unilasalle Rennes.

The Rennes CMI is a **one-stop information desk** which makes available:

- assistance for administrative procedures
- support in putting together the application file for a residence permit with the presence of Prefecture staff on site (during the first semester and occasionally throughout the rest of the year).
- advice and good deals (housing, health, work, food service, transportation, and more.)
- Euraxess researchers service.

# GETTING AROUND RENNES



X If you arrive at the Rennes Bretagne airport, you can take the 57 bus which goes downtown (Republic stop). The ride is 20 minutes and the bus runs every day of the week: https://www.rennes.aeroport.fr/ acces-parkings/bus



To get to Rennes by train from Paris, take the high-speed TGV at Montparnasse station: https://www.oui.sncf/

#### **ENROLLMENT IN YOUR INSTITUTION**

#### **◆ CVEC**

Before you can enroll in your institution, you must download proof of payment of the Contribution Vie Etudiante et de Campus (CVEC) – the student and campus life contribution fee.

#### ◆ Confirm Registration

Take note! Even if you have a pre-registration letter, you are not officially enrolled. You must confirm your enrollment with the institution's Service de la Scolarité (Admissions) as soon as you arrive.

#### RESIDENCE PERMIT (TITRE DE SÉJOUR)

#### Information

- The Rennes CMI, at the Welcome and Administrative Procedures Desk.
- **September to December**, Prefecture agents are present on site to process residence permit applications or renewals for international students in **CMI member establishments**.

- End May to early July, a desk for summer acknowledgements (récépissés d'été) is also available to extend the validity of your residence permit through the start of classes in the fall. - The Ille-et-Vilaine (Rennes) Prefecture, for students enrolled in institutions not a member of the CMI (by appointment only).

#### **GOOD TO KNOW**

- If you arrive in France with a VLS-TS long-term student visa: You must validate it online within three months of arrival: https://administration-etrangers-en-france. interieur.gouv.fr
- If you are an Algerian national or a student with a "concours" (tests) visa or a "mineur scolarisé" (enrolled minor) visa or a visa with the indication "carte à solliciter dans les deux mois" (residence permit to be requested within 2 months of entry): Depending on your campus, your residence permit application is made at the Préfecture or with the Service des Relations Internationales at your campus.

**Take note: To renew your residence permit**, you must apply within two months prior to its expiration date.



#### **OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT**

If you stay in France for more than 3 months, it will be much easier day-to-day if you open a bank account, online or in one of the 145 bank agencies located in Rennes.

In France, opening a bank account is a right: www.service-public.fr > Argent > Comptes bancaires> Droit au compte

#### **HEALTHCARE**

In France, receiving medical treatment is **practically free** but you must be insured. **Accordingly, signing up for medical insurance is mandatory.**

As a student, you can also take advantage of the university medical services. In these health centers where consultations are free, you will be greeted by a team of doctors and nurses who can give personalized advice about health and prevention.

That's the case in Rennes where the two universities and Grandes Écoles joined up to offer a Service Interuniversitaire de Médecine Préventive et de Promotion de la Santé, or inter-university preventive health and health promotion service (SIMPPS).

This service has two branch offices depending on your host institution.

#### ADDITIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE

You can also sign up for **top-up insurance** which will cover all health expenses not covered by the **free** and compulsory health insurance.

Take note: The plans and coverage levels differ from one company to another. To choose a **top-up insurance policy** which meets your needs and your budget, **you can compare student health insurance plans** on the Internet.

#### HOUSING INSURANCE

#### In France, housing insurance is mandatory.

The "garantie risques locatifs" - rental risk guarantee - is housing insurance which you can you subscribe with your bank or a private insurance company. Online subscription is also often possible.

#### **EMERGENCY NUMBERS**

**Police emergency: Call 17** in the event of violence, theft, robbery.

**Fire Department: Call 18** in the event of fire, gas leak, water damage, natural catastrophe, or traffic accident.

Call 112: European emergency services number that's accessible from anywhere in the European Union in addition to the French numbers above.

- around twenty book shops including an institution, Librairie Le Failler, in Rennes since 1925 (with a foreign languages department) and a used book shop to buy and sell, the Bouquinerie du Centre.

## In 1986, Rennes was awarded the label "Ville d'art et d'histoire", a city of art and history.

- The Parlement de Bretagne, the most famous of Rennes monuments, a symbol of Brittany.
- Rennes old town, part of the old city with many houses from the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> centuries.
- La place des Lices, the former medieval enclosed fields, one of the largest market squares in France
- Hôtel de Ville or City Hall square, the central hub in Rennes with the Opera House and Commerce Building.
- The Portes Mordelaises gates and ramparts, a testimony to Breton history.
- Saint-Pierre Cathedral, where important moments in French and Breton history took place.
- Les Champs Libres, an innovative cultural venue at the heart of Rennes with the Museum of Brittany, the Science Space, and the Metropolitan area library.
- Thabor gardens, 10 hectares of French-style gardens and an English-style park with an exceptional rose garden.

#### **APRIL**

- Mythos, the festival for the spoken arts (storytellers, singers) in Thabor Park
- Rennes Urban Trail, an atypical sports challenge, a race through the city's monuments, gardens, and symbolic venues.

#### MAY

- Fête de la Bretagne, over 230 events throughout the region (concerts, exhibitions, traditional festivals, markets. and more).
- European Museum Night, with free admission to museums from 8pm to midnight.

#### JUNE

• Fête de la Musique: Music everywhere in town (free concerts).

#### JULY - AUGUST

• Les Tombées de la Nuit, a street arts festival with free events all summer long.

#### **SEPTEMBER**

- International Student Day, organized by the Rennes CMI in partnership with CROUS, a big day to welcome international students.
- European Researchers Night: Researchers meet the general public.
- Les Journées du Patrimoine (heritage days), free visits of cultural venues.

#### **OCTOBER**

- World Football Championship, organized by Rennes CMI in partnership with the SIUAPS and the Rennes soccer team, Stade Rennais F.C.,
- Students of the World Night, an essential event at the start of the school year for international students organized by the Erasmus Student Network (ESN France).
- Tam-Tam Festival, the best deals festival for young people in Rennes, organized by the Bretagne CRIJ and other partners.
- Fête de la Science in the University laboratories.

#### NOVEMBER

• Yaouank, the must-attend festival for contemporary Breton music and the largest fest-noz (night party) in Bretagne (preferential rates with the Sortir Card).

#### **DECEMBER**

• Rennes Trans Musicales, a key event in contemporary music and the musical trends of tomorrow (student rates)


