

Rennes is a multi-faceted city located in the Brittany region of northwestern France. Known for its rich history, vibrant culture, and dynamic student population, Rennes offers a blend of old-world charm and modern amenities.

Rennes, a dynamic city with a strong Breton character

With a population of approximately 450,000 (and over 700,000 when taking into account the larger metropolitan area), Rennes is the 10th largest city in France. More than 73,000 of its inhabitants are students who enjoy all the city has to offer: an excellent higher education offer, festivals throughout the year, an economic vitality that comes with being located in the region's capital, a natural proximity to the coast and more.

The city of Rennes has been designated as city of 'Art and History' and offers a number of major cultural sites (opera, theaters, symphony orchestras, the Parliament, museums, libraries, etc.). The cultural programming of the city is diverse and constantly changing thanks to its dynamic population whose ideas help to keep it vibrant and original.

Over the last decade, the city has heavily invested in urban revitalisation of the city-centre and the surrounding infrastructure. These ambitious plans, combined with the rich cultural and social offering of the city, has produced substantial results. For a number of years, the city of Rennes has been steadily climbing the ranks of the most desirable cities for quality of life in French surveys.

Every year, the magazine *l'Etudiant* ranks the most student-friendly French cities.

In 2024, the magazine named Rennes as the 2nd most enjoyable city for students in France (out of a ranking of 47 French cities), noting in particular the: diversity of quality higher education institutions, living conditions, public transportation services, range of cultural activities and the proximity to coastal landscapes as some of the main advantages. Criteria such as air quality, the presence of night transportation and the proportion of international students were also taken into account.
