

The Mazier campus of Rennes 2 University in the city of Saint-Brieuc has been offering undergraduate courses since 1991.

Four general bachlor's degree courses are offered: Sports sciences, Social and Economic Administration, History, Languages Applied to Business (English/Spanish), as well as four professional bachelor's degree courses (tourism and heritage; audiovisual and digital; nature sport; technical professions in local authorities).


Located on the northern coast of Brittany, (one hour from Rennes and two and a half hours from Paris by train), Saint-Brieuc is the city center of a metropolitan area of approximately 150,000 inhabitants. Situated between land and sea, the Bay of Saint-Brieuc offers an outstanding quality of life. The landscape is strikingly diverse, with characterful towns and villages built of granite and timber-framed houses, fishing and yachting harbors, wooded areas, beaches and rivers...

Anchored in tradition, Saint-Brieuc is also renowned for its Art Rock festival and street art facades.

Every year, Saint-Brieuc welcomes 6,000 students, including over 2,500 on the Mazier university campus.

By choosing to study in Saint-Brieuc, you benefit from the advantages of a dynamic campus on a human scale, as well as an exceptional environment that encourages outdoor activities: sailing, kayaking, fishing, trail running, walking, cycling...

A wide range of cultural and sporting activities are also offered at a reduced price for students.



### **UNIVERSITY CALENDAR**

1st semester courses:

Early September to mid-December

2<sup>nd</sup> semester courses:

Early January to mid-April

Exam sessions take place in the two weeks following the end of courses.

# REGISTRATION PROCEDURE FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

To register as an exchange student:


- Consult your home university to find out about its application procedure.
- Your university will inform the International Office of Rennes 2 University of your selection.
- The International Office will then send you its registration procedure and the link to the registration portal by e-mail.

Deadline for submitting application forms, signed and stamped by your home country coordinator:

- Mid-May for a 1st semester exchange
- Mid-October for a 2<sup>nd</sup> semester exchange

### **LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION**

Most courses are taught in French. To make the most of their stay, exchange students should have a B2 level in French. Students may be offered French as a foreign language courses.



### **GRADING**

16+ = A Excellent

Between 14 and 16 = B Very good

Between 12 and 14 = C Good

Between 10 and 12 = D Satisfactory

10- = F Fail

ABI = Absent from examination

One semester = 30 ECTS

### **COURSES**

Exchange students can choose courses in two different departments (linked to their program of study), with a maximum of 36 ECTS per semester.

## WHEN TO REGISTER FOR COURSES

Exchange students receive specific advice and information on course selection during the Welcome Week organized at the beginning of each semester. They have around two weeks to finalize their choice.

Is it possible to register for just one semester?

Yes, but partners must ensure that the number of students selected is evenly distributed between the two semesters.

### **WELCOME WEEK**

When you arrive in Saint-Brieuc, you'll be able to gather a wealth of information during the welcome week organized at the start of each semester. This integration and orientation week is compulsory. Visits will be organized to help you discover Saint-Brieuc and the surrounding area.

Exchange students must request a room on the online application form and submit it by the deadline. There is a limited number of rooms available in student residences. The rule is "first-come, first-served".

## HOW MUCH DOES ACCOMMODATION COST?

University residence: around €250/month. Students who wish to do so can also look for accommodation on their own, outside university residences, but this is more difficult and more expensive.

### **AVERAGE COST OF LIVING IN SAINT-BRIEUC**

This depends entirely on the student's lifestyle. A meal in a university restaurant costs 3.30€. A bus ticket costs 2€, but there are several cheaper subscription options.

### **HEALTH INSURANCE**

In France, health insurance is free and compulsory for all: it's called "Sécurité Sociale" and is managed by the Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie (CPAM). Social Security reimburses your health expenses. When studying in France, students from the European Economic Area are covered by the social security system of their country of origin; other students must register with the French social security system to benefit from the same protection as French students.

### HEALTH

The Student Health Service is open to all students and offers free medical consultations. A team of doctors, psychologists, dieticians and nurses is at their disposal.


## **HANDICAP**
